I'm particularly proud to have been able to run this project in the Library, the first of its kind ever in Australia, and I'm looking forward to seeing the plays come to life on stage at our gala Mighty Playwrights performance at the Lieder Theatre on Sunday 29 March. The Mighty Playwrights project has been about supporting and inspiring our young people to discover the power of their own thoughts and voices through storytelling and improved literacy, and also about reminding us oldies that children have incredible value in society.

I would like to thank Luke Wallace and the team at the Paperback Café and Marie and the team at the Bookshop Bowral for your help and support for our festival. My most sincere thanks to the whole Library team for all of your continued hard work and dedication to our Library and to providing such high quality resources and events for the Goulburn Mulwaree region. Richard Glover's weekly humour column has been published in the Sydney Morning Herald for over twenty years. He writes regularly for The Washington Post and also presents the top-rating Drive show on ABC radio in Sydney. In December 2011 he and Peter FitzSimons achieved a record for the world's longest radio interview, supervised by the Guinness Book of Records.

Richard's most recent book is The land before avocado – a journey into a lost Australia, the bizarre Australia of the late 60s and early 70s. It's been

described by Hugh Mackay as "warm, wise and very, very funny", and by Annabel Crabb as "hilarious and horrifying, the ultimate intergenerational conversation starter'.

PETER FITZSIMONS is a well respected columnist for The Sydney Morning Herald and Sun-Herald, speaks four languages, has played rugby for Australia, co-hosted radio shows with Mike Carlton and Doug Mulray, interviewed famous people around the globe from George Bush to Diego Maradona, is the Chair of the Autralian Republican Movement, and has written over 27 best-selling books.

He is the biographer not only of World Cup winning Wallaby captains, Nick Farr-Jones and John Eales, but also former Opposition Leader Kim Beazley, boxer Les Darcy, aviator Sir Charles Kingsford Smith, war heroine Nancy Wake, and Antarctic explorer Sir Douglas Mawson. In 2001 he was Australia's biggest

selling non-fiction author, and duplicated that feat in 2004, with his book on Kokoda. In November 2013 released his current best-seller on Ned Kelly. The most popular after-dinner speaker in Australia, he is married to The Project co-host Lisa Wilkinson and they have three children.

Peter boasts an impressive list of interview credits including ex-president George Bush, Sir Edmund Hillary, Jodie Foster, Nicki Lauda, Joe Montana, and Carl Lewis as well as all the major Australian sporting figures from Shane Gould to Lionel Rose to Herb Elliot. He has interviewed every Australian Prime Minister from Gough Whitlam through to Julia Gillard.



Markus Zusak is the author of five books, including the international bestseller, The book thief, which is translated into more than forty languages. First released in 2006, The book thief, has remained on the New York Times bestseller list since its publication. The book, which was made into a major motion picture, was awarded the 2014 Margaret A Edwards Award for lifetime achievement in writing for young adults. Zusak lectures around the world, inspiring audiences with his own story of becoming a writer and giving an insider's look at the crafting of his incredibly celebrated novel.

His first three books, The underdog, Fighting Ruben Wolfe and When dogs cry (also known as Getting the girl), released between 1999 and 2001, were all published internationally and garnered a number of awards and honours in his native Australia, and the USA. The messenger (or I am the messenger), published in 2002, won the 2003 Australian Children's Book Council Book of the Year Award (Older Readers) and the 2003 NSW Premier's Literary Award (Ethel Turner Prize), as well as receiving a Printz Honour in America.

Zusak's latest book, Bridge of clay, is a sweeping family saga chronicling the lives of five brothers who bring each other up in a world run on their own rules. At the center of the Dunbar family is Clay, a boy who will build a bridge—for his family, for his past, for greatness, for his sins, for a miracle. A New York Times bestseller, it was named one of the best books of 2019 by Entertainment Weekly and the Wall Street Journal.

Currently, Muffy is a member of The Lieder Theatre Board and treasurer of the Goulburn Local A.E.C.G. (Aboriginal Education Consultative Group). Muffy came to Goulburn in 1978 and trained as a teacher at Goulburn College of Advanced Education. Since then, she has regularly contributed in a variety of capacities, be it on stage, in bands, choirs or the orchestra pit, in countless productions, recitals and performances. As a teacher in the public school system for 39 years, she has voluntarily trained hundreds of children in choirs and poetry recitals for the Goulburn Eisteddfod.

Recognising the beneficial lifelong value of participating in the Creative and Performing Arts to the development of the whole child, it is that which motivates Muffy to continue to provide children with experiences they can pursue or indeed, later draw on as adults. *Muffy has been mentoring Indyana from Wollondilly Public School and Xage from the Home School Network*.

#### Jacqueline de Rose-Ahern



Jacqueline de Rose-Ahern is a Canberra based author and recipient of the ACT Writers Centre 2017 Anne Edgeworth Fellowship. Her debut picture book, Charlie's adventures...in Hawaii, was shortlisted for the 2017 Speech Pathology Australia Book of the Year Awards and was a finalist in the American Best Book Awards. The subsequent book in the Charlie's Adventures...series, Charlie's adventures...in South Africa, was recently shortlisted for the 2019 Speech Pathology Australia Book of the Year Awards. Jacqueline is currently working on an upcoming title with Penguin Random House Australia. Jacqueline regularly contributes to a variety of online platforms and has appeared at several literary events, including the Canberra Writers Festival, the Goulburn Reader Writer

Festival, NSW Kids & YA Festival and the Noted Writers Festival. She has also toured her books internationally. Jacqueline is the Founder and Director of the Story Creators Community, assisting aspiring creatives on their journey by offering tailored talks and workshops around the country. She holds a Masters in International Development and works in international affairs. Jacqueline has been mentoring Evie from St Joseph's Primary School and Ryleigh from Goulburn West Public School.

#### **David Atfield**



David Atfield is one of Canberra's most respected directors and playwrights, having won two Canberra Critics Circle Awards and been the recipient of sixteen government grants. He studied drama at the University of New South Wales and acting with Hayes Gordon at the Ensemble Studios in Sydney, graduating from both in 1986. He then went on to complete the Directing Course at the National Institute of Dramatic Art (NIDA) in 1991, where he also wrote and directed his first play *An honest communist: The story of Meyerhold*. Moving to Canberra in 1992 he worked with Company

Skylark and formed his own company BITS Theatre Company (A Break In The Silence). He is currently working on a commission from the Street Theatre to write a play about HIV in the ACT, thanks to a grant from the ACT Government's Capital of Equality Progam. The play, with the working title *The future is u* will be workshopped in October/November 2020 and have a public presentation on World AIDS Day, December 1 2020 at the Street Theatre. David has been mentoring Ashlee from Tarago Public School and Mikayla from Goulburn South

#### **Parking**


Free parking is available at the rear of the Council building, off Clifford Street. Additional free parking is also available on side roads and on Bourke Street.
